May 29, 2025 Golf Course News From the Superintendent

Three days into the first closure and there is something happening in almost every corner around the community.

The painters officially started on Wednesday by pressure washing and prepping the proshop and cart barn. They will be applying



the primer and base coat today followed by trim and accent colors Friday and Monday. Once the proshop is completed they will work on the club house, activity center and administration building over the next two weeks. The Architectural Review committee's sub design



committee chose an up-to-date color palate that will feature three colors on all buildings and two colors on the Bonita Beach Road wall. There is a light creamy white base color for the buildings complemented by a dark grey trim and a light grey accent color. The buildings will be painted in a way that accents the architectural details with these two grey trim colors. The wall along Bonita Beach Road and columns along Bonita Grande Drive will be painted with the two grey colors and the ornamental fencing will be repainted black. The painting project will provide a great refresh for Worthington, as the buildings are completed we will provide before and after pictures for everyone.



The golf course bathrooms are on track to be ready for June 14th as well. The contractors started on Tuesday and have been hard at work and almost have the demolition completed. The electrician has been working around the demolition team and

almost has the new electrical rough in done as well. This is great news for a project that has a tight timeline. As the demolition is completed, they will work on patching the stucco and replacing the ceilings and soffits so the finish work can begin.

Even with all this going on, we still must make the golf course our top priority and there has been no delays to the cultural practices on the course because of these improvement projects. On Tuesday the greens were verticut and the linear aeration started on fairways and rough up to the cart



path. Greens were also aerated yesterday and completed just before the RAIN! We did lose about 3 hours of work yesterday because of the rain but it was much needed and welcomed even though we have so much work to accomplish, we received about 1.5" yesterday afternoon. The driving range tee fraze mowing was completed this morning and we started the process of topdressing the greens as well.
